### **Taste of Australia 2026 – Celebrating Premium Australian Produce in Cambodia**

The Australian Embassy in Cambodia proudly hosted Taste of Australia 2026, bringing together Australian food, wine, cheese and spirits for an evening celebrating quality food and flavours.

Held in Phnom Penh, the event welcomed brought together senior representatives from government, business, hospitality, the food and beverage industry and media, as well as prominent figures in Cambodia’s premium culinary scene.

The menu featured a range of Australian ingredients, including Dinko Southern Bluefin Tuna from South Australia, Spencer Gulf prawns, Bangalow sweet pork from Byron Bay, Stanbroke Wagyu beef cheek from Queensland’s Darling Downs and finger limes and lemon myrtle in a pavlova dessert native Australian flavours.

Guests also enjoyed Jindi Camembert from Victoria, Haigh’s Chocolates from Adelaide, Lark whisky from Tasmania and Four Pillars gin from Healesville, Victoria, reflecting the breadth of Australian’s premium food and beverage offering.

This year, Taste of Australia also extends beyond the dinner table. From 26 June to 25 July, the Australian Embassy is partnering with Lucky Supermarkets on a Taste of Australia campaign across 10 stores, giving shoppers the opportunity to discover a wide range of Australian products available right here in Cambodia.

Taste of Australia 2026 is part of the Embassy’s ongoing efforts to showcase premium Australian produce and deepen the bilateral trade ties between Australia and Cambodia.

Australian Ambassador to the Kingdom of Cambodia, H.E. Derek Yip, said, ‘Taste of Australia is about sharing the diversity and calibre of Australian produce with our friends in Cambodia. From our farms and fisheries to our vineyards and artisan producers, Australia offers products that renowned globally for their premium quality, safety and sustainability.’

'Cambodia imports around A\$100 million worth of Australian agricultural and food products each year, including A\$32 million in dairy, A\$17 million in beef, and A\$25 million in cereal products.'

Emma McDonald, Austrade's Senior Trade and Investment Commissioner for Vietnam and Cambodia, said 'Cambodia is an increasingly important market for Australian food and agricultural exports, supported by growing consumer demand for premium, high-quality products.'
